Key Word	Definition
NAACP	National Association for the Advancement of Coloured People – a civil rights activist group.
KKK	Klu Klux Klan – a white supremacist group.
Amendment	A change to the constitution (the laws) of America which every state must follow.
Segregation	To keep separate – often used to describe keeping black and white people apart.
Desegregation	To stop being separate – to mix white and black people together.
Discrimination	Prejudice or unjust action based on differences such as age, gender or race.
Unconstitutional	Does not follow the constitution i.e. is not following the laws about how the country should be run.
