## Child Work Permits

Did you know, it is a legal requirement that all young people between the age of 13-16 yrs. require a Child Work Permit if they have a part time job?

Employment of children is controlled by Legislation and there are certain types of work they are NOT allowed to do: -
This includes working in a cinema, an industrial site or a commercial kitchen. You cannot work with harmful chemicals or collect or sort refuse.

## Permitted employment includes:-

- Light agricultural work.
- Delivering newspapers and newsletters.
- Shop work, including shelf stacking and working on the tills.
- Working in a hairdressing salon.
- Doing office work.
- Working in a café or restaurant (not in the commercial kitchen).
- Helping at a riding stables.
- Doing domestic work in a hotel.

The child's employer must apply for a Child Work Permit using the online application system from Dorset Council. The application must then be completed by the parent/ guardian and school.
